The RTO carried out remedial action to identify and address the impact the non-compliance may have caused to current and former students that were impacted by training and assessment practices that did not meet the requirements of the training product. Clause 1.8 The RTO has corrected its assessment system for future students and has systems in place to ensure it is this system that is applied. The RTO carried out remedial action to identify and address the impact the non-compliance may have caused to learners that were assessed in a manner that did not meet the requirements of Clause 1.8.
<b>3.1 Completion</b>	Building Industry Training did not demonstrate that it issues AQF certification documentation only to a learner whom it has assessed as meeting the requirements of the training product as specified in the relevant training package	The RTO has rectified the non-compliance identified in respect of Clause 1.8 of the Standards for RTOs for the sampled training products to ensure that, in accordance with the requirements of Clause 3.1, AQF certification documentation is only issued to a learner who is assessed as fully meeting the requirements of the training product as specified in the relevant training package. The RTO has carried out remedial action to identify and address the non-compliance with Clause 1.8 may have caused to former learners who were issued AQF certification and who were not assessed as fully meeting the requirements of the training product as specified in the relevant training package.
